GLOSSARY OF STYLES

Chairs

Executive

An Executive Chair generally is a full-featured mid-back or high-back desk chair that offers high-end comfort and adjustable controls, ideal for private office settings.

Task

Task chairs offer comfort for all-day work, they typically include a 360-degree swivel, adjustable seat height, and other features that allow for comfortable reclining and optimal support. Task chairs are designed to accommodate a diverse range of body types and sizes.

Stool

Most offices utilize counter or bar height stools, other features may include casters for mobility, space-saving folding or stackable stools, and upholstered stools for style and comfort.

Club/Lounge

Club/Lounge chairs are typically covered in leather or plush upholstery, this comfortable armchair seat is for a single user and is often used in lounge settings.

Ergonomic

Ergonomic chair design is rooted in optimal support to the human body. It is designed to apply principles from psychology and physiology to well-being and productivity.

Guest/Side

A single-seat chair designed for short-term use and often placed in open areas, waiting rooms, and private offices.

Conference

A conference chair, or boardroom chair, is slightly upright, with the arms raised to encourage a more forward-leaning posture that fosters group interaction and involvement.

Breakroom

Breakroom chairs come in standard, counter, and bar height. They provide a comfortable place for individuals to rest while they eat, read, or socialize.

Multi-Purpose

A side or guest chair with a seat that can flip up vertically (nesting) allowing it to be pushed closely against other chairs. Or a chair with a seat that remains flat which may be stacked. A chair that has multiple uses, based upon need.

Outdoor

Weather-resistant and modern outdoor seating for office patio furniture. Commercial outdoor furniture is built for long-term durability with sun and weather-resistant cushions, rigid steel poles, and scratch-resistant powder-coated finishes.

Desk

L-Shaped

A desk made up of two rectangular pieces that form a shape like a letter "L". L-shaped desks create a large work area, optimize space, and provide versatile configurations.

U-Shaped

A U-shaped desk combines functionality and style design and typically consists of three connected components. A main desk, a credenza or a bridge, and a hutch with optional overhead storage.

Height Adjustable

Height-adjustable desks are designed to offer flexibility allowing the user to transition between sitting or standing positions. Users have the option of electric, manual, crank, and ergonomic height-adjustable desks.

Office Desk

An office desk typically features a flat tabletop that serves as the primary work surface. It can be made from various materials including wood, metal, glass, or a combination of both.

Desk Sets

A desk set includes a desk and matching office furniture pieces like a credenza. These complementary pieces create a cohesive and coordinated look for your workspace.

Reception Desk

A reception desk is normally in a waiting room, lobby, or in front of an office, that is used for anything from greeting customers, answering the telephone, or scheduling appointments. An inviting reception area set the tone for the entire office experience.

Cubicles

Monolithic

Monolithic cubicles consist of solid fabric walls typically of a single color and a uniform appearance. Their simple design allows for efficient use of materials and is a great choice when budget is a consideration.

Tile & Frame

These systems are known for their stylish, high-quality, customizable designs. Installation is easy, walls can be composed of different tiles, different colors, patterns, fabric, or glass. These systems offer the greatest flexibility in terms of design and upkeep.

Benching

Benching is a type of office furniture arrangement that features cubicles without walls. These open workstations can be configured in a pod or a run. They are often used in open office concepts to encourage teamwork and communication.

Soft Seating

Sofa/Loveseat

Commercial office furniture is manufactured with denser foam to provide sitting support, stronger bases, and customizable upholstery. These furniture pieces can be customized to offer adjustable feet, USB charging, and adjustable tables.

Collaborative

Benches

Storage

Credenza

A storage cabinet that can be added as a stand-alone, onto the worksurface of an office component

such as a desk or wall mounted without sacrificing floor space.

Filing Cabinet

Office filing cabinets are typically made of sheet metal or wood. A vertical file cabinet has drawers that extend from the short side of the cabinet. A lateral file cabinet has drawers that extend from the long side of the cabinet.

Locker / Wardrobe

These are essential in workplaces where employees need secure storage or common areas where clients can put personal belongings. Whether it's a busy breakroom, or office space, lockers and wardrobes provide a safe place for personal belongings in any commercial setting.
